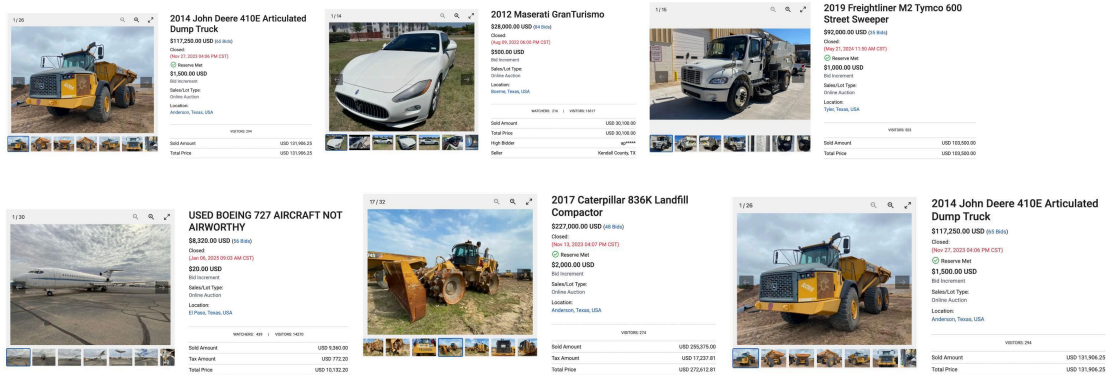
Because the Twin Oaks Landfill utilizes and sells so many pieces of heavy equipment, we’re lucky to have Kaleb Schumann as our Account Manager.
